

Which Class Should I Register In?

BALLET LEVELS

New Students with No Training:

Beginner Class by Age: 3 yr; 4-5 yr.; 6-8 yr; 9-15 yr.; 16+-adults

New Students with Some training, including ballet (no recent recognized exams):

JAZZ LEVELS

If the student has had an equal amount of Jazz training, they should initially try one level lower than ballet. For example, someone in Ballet 3 would register in Jazz 2.

If the student has had more jazz training than ballet, then try the equivalent Jazz class – i.e. Ballet 3 would register in Jazz 3 (which would have our Cecchetti/RAD 3 students).

If a student has modern and/or tap training, they should be assessed in a class that has students registered who are approximately the same age and number of years of training.
